AGM Speaker Prof. Bevan Grant Dr. Bevan Grant, Emeritus Professor of Sport and Leisure Studies, University of Waikato, delighted our April 26 AGM audience with his "Living Forever or Die Trying" presentation. His long career has in recent years, focussed on gerontology and he is a familiar figure in academic and community positive ageing events. Bevan incorporated findings from Nelson's recently released research to underscore the implications and potential behind the projected increase in median age and overall percentage of our older population in coming years. These numbers are part of an international trend.

The potential rests in our proactive physical and mental engagement with our surroundings and ever-increasing opportunities for trying something new — or, in some cases, after too many years away, something old. Of course, any activity such as sport, needs to accommodate inevitable changes in ability and stamina.

Bevan notes that in some cases, it's the people closest to us who may find it difficult to discard stereotypes and accustom themselves to our new activities and personna!

2014 29


